

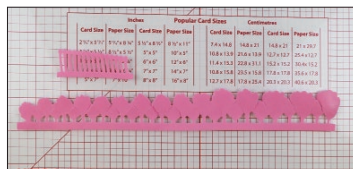


FLOWER MAKING

USB VOL.1



ROLLED FLOWER



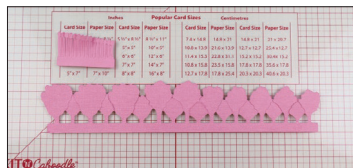
1. Cut the Flower from Fleurs Foam, paper, or card.
2. Starting with the smallest pieces, roll into a tight coil, using glue to hold into place.



3. You should have something that looks like a closed bud.
4. Form, curl and fold out the petals to create a full open bloom.

PLEATED FLOWER

(Edge to Edge flowers with pleated marks are in the 'card' folder).



1. Cut the Flower from card, paper or Fleurs Foam.
2. Fold or pleat along the small lines and glue to hold.

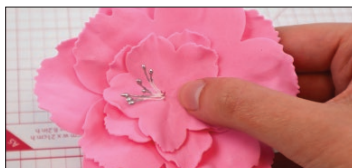


3. Starting with the smallest pieces, roll into a tight coil, using glue to hold into place.
4. Form, curl and fold out the petals to create a full open bloom.

LAYERED STAMEN FLOWER



1. Cut the Flower from Fleurs Foam, paper or card.
2. Form and curl the petals for texture.



3. Layer your pieces and make a hole in the centre using a Pokey Tool. Thread a stamen through the hole.
4. Form and shape the petals around the stamen, giving the flower form and shape.

LAYERED BUD FLOWER

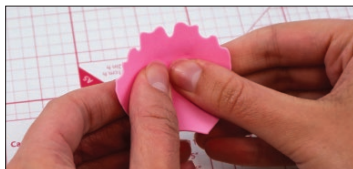


1. Cut the Flower from Fleurs Foam, paper or card.
2. Form and curl the petals for texture.



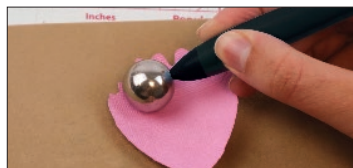
2. Starting with the smallest pieces, form the centre bud of your flower.
3. Add and glue the petals or pieces around the bud to form the flower.

SHAPING TIPS



SHAPING FLEURS FOAM

Use a heat gun or the warmth of your hands to mould into shape. Using a ball tool or your thumb, press into the petal and stretch the foam. Press on the front to form concave petals or on the back to form convex petals.



SHAPING PAPER OR CARD

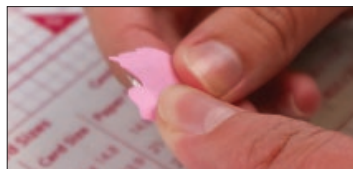
Using a ball tool and a foam mat, spray lightly with water. Press into the petal and roll along the length of the petal. Press on the front to form concave petals or on the back to form convex petals.

CURLING EDGES



SHAPING FLEURS FOAM

Use a heat gun or the warmth of your hands to mould the Fleurs Foam into shape. Take the edges of the petal and pull gently to curl or 'frill' the edges.



SHAPING PAPER

Use a Pokey Tool, wrap the edges of the petal over the side of the tool. Whilst pressing, pull and curl the paper around the tool to curl the edges.

INKING FLOWERS

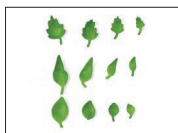


We recommend using water soluble pastels or distress crayons to ink and shade your Fleurs Foam. Liquid inks or alcohol based products will not work as well.

FLOWERS

The USB contains 2 folders, Foam & Card.

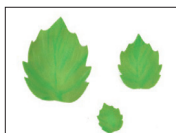
Some of the SVG files in the card folder contain additional cut lines or details. This is due to the different properties of the material when cut and shaped. With foam patterns you may need to break connection points between petals. For card, you might need to adjust your blade depth and/or pressure, to cut through the connection points.
